## The Midas Touch

Remember the story of King Midas? He was invited to make a wish, and he wished that everything he touched be turned to gold. At first the king had a whale of a time turning pots, vases, and simple household utensils into valuable objects. It didn't take him long however to work out that his love of gold was about to

destroy everything most precious to him, as he turned food, butterflies and finally his beloved daughter into solid lumps of metal.

In many ways we are just as foolish as Midas. How many people do you know who won't go anywhere unless it's safe to park their brand new car? How many of us watch the aid agency adverts and sympathise, yet decide we can't part with any cash right now? How many of us cannot get up and get involved in worthy causes because our work commitments come first? We are just the same as Midas. Our material concerns stand in the way of what is really important.

The man in today's gospel story was not a bad man; he had kept all God's commandments. This makes the story all the sadder, that he couldn't follow Jesus because of the one thing that stood in his way, his wealth. The man turned away, because he had much wealth and couldn't let go. Today's gospel invites the question, 'Do we own our possessions, or do our possessions own us?'

#### Pope Francis' Prayer Intention October - For a Shared Mission

When bishops and lay people meet for the second part of the Synod on Synodality during October, the faithful are asked to pray that "the Church continues to sustain a synodal lifestyle in every way."

**How do we respect our elderly?** In a docuseries on Netflix, *Live to 100, Secrets of the Blue Zones,* Dan Buettner investigates why certain area in the world have a higher proportion of centenarians. Obviously healthy diet and exercise factor in, but it's significant that in these places, community and family is important and old age is greatly respected, giving the elderly an ongoing sense of dignity, purpose and being valued and loved. In these societies, the elderly aren't made to feel that they are a burden, but a treasure.

In the ongoing debate around assisted suicide, elderly people have voiced that they may choose this option because they don't want to be a burden on their families.

On 16th October the House of Commons will hear the first reading of a new bill on assisted suicide. The Bishops of England and Wales are urging Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose assisted suicide.
